Program Information

Since 1984, Regional Consolidated Services has ministered to the elderly and disabled of Randolph County. The Home Care program provides in-home assistance seniors in Randolph County who are over 60 with at least one functional disability allowing them to remain Independent and safe in their homes.

RCS employs Level 1 Certified Nursing Assistants and homemakers.

Supervision is provided under the direction of a registered nurse.

The Home Care Program is licensed under the Division of Facilities Services, NC department of Human

Resources. It is funded through the Title III Older Americans Act and NC State Funds for the Elderly, and United Way of Randolph County.

Persons who receive assistance can make monthly contributions to the program based on a sliding fee scale. Private pay clients are also accepted.



In Home Assistance

- Planning nutritious meals
- Food preparation
- Basic personal care (bathing, shaving, hair grooming etc.)
- Assistance with household budgets
- Household duties (light housekeeping, washing dishes, vacuuming etc.)
- General skin care
- Toileting
- Positioning/turning
- Assistance with feeding
- Assistance with activities of daily living
- Range of motion exercises
- Care for clothing (washing, drying, folding)
- Nail care for non-diabetic clients
- Respite for caregivers



Minor Home Improvement This program is contingent upon funding

A component of the Home Care program offers minor home improvements and repairs to eligible clients in Randolph County. Inaugurated in 1988, the program is designed to improve the efficiency and safety of an older adult's residence while maintaining their independence in the home.

It all began when the Home Care Program became aware of an initiative taken by the Tabernacle Volunteer Fire Department in a Randolph County community that undertook the task of providing smoke alarms in homes of the disadvantaged. RCS gravitated to the support of the project and a full-fledged effort of expansion took place.

Services are provided to Randolph County residents who are age 60 or over, have a functional disability and may be socially or economically disadvantaged.
